## Meet The Peters Family of Seminole, TX

On December 4th, 2020, 13 year old Esther Peters was in an ATV accident in Seminole. Airlifted to Lubbock and admitted to University Medical Center, Esther's prognosis was grim. Her parents, Abe and Helena sat by her side. After their 2nd day by her bedside, social workers at UMC referred the Peters to RMHC.

Esther's mother, Helena shared, "We didn't know anything about Ronald McDonald House until we were told by the hospital we should send our registration. We were approved to stay at The House and right away we felt this was a place where we could get comfort. The staff was always checking in on our family. We had good meals and a comfortable room. Having this place where we could stay and get rest made our 6 weeks so much less stressful.





Abe and I were able to take turns sitting with Esther and going to RMHC to eat and rest and get cleaned up. It was such a relief. This place is amazing."

Helena also shared, "The meals were so nice and there were always snacks and coffee available so we didn't have to think about where we would go to get meals or drinks and how to afford staying close to

our daughter. We could just focus on Esther and know that RMHC would take care of thinking of those things for us. They were just always ready for us with whatever we needed. It took the stress away from us."

After 18 days on a ventilator and an extended hospital stay, Esther was released from UMC and transferred to Trustpoint Rehabilitation Hospital for rehabilitation. After six weeks, Esther and her family were finally able to go home to Seminole.

Although her journey to full recovery continues, Esther is doing well. When the family returns to Lubbock for scheduled visits, they are able to stay at RMHC.

"I feel so honored and special to be asked to share our story. This place has been so good for us and so many other families and I'm happy to share that story to help families that need RMHC in the future." Helena said.
