"A dear friend of mine went through the traumatic and life altering experience of having a child in medical crisis. With no option but to continue supporting his family by working, my friend was unable to be near his child, and the family suffered and struggled through a drawn out and difficult journey.

I watched as my friend grew weary, and wished I could do more to help. It was difficult to see. In addition to the emotional and physical hardship, it was a huge financial drain on the family as one of the parents had to stop working to care for their child. Walking through that with my friend was painful and I felt helpless.

Years later, I learned about Ronald McDonald House and I knew that the services and support offered at RMHC would have made a major difference for my friend and his family. I also know that families like his are going through these things every day. So I'm fired up to help families during their trying time!

Meet the Cypert Family of Lubbock, TX



After the heart-break of a miscarriage, Wade and Sarah Cypert received the happy news that Sarah was pregnant, but testing showed that their baby had health issues. Baby Cypert had a cleft palate that would require specialized care after birth. The Cypert's prepared for the

challenges and anxiously awaited their baby's December 25th due date.

At a summer check-up they discovered Sarah was in pre-term labor. The next 3 months, Sarah would spend on hospital bed rest at Covenant Hospital.

"It wasn't how I imagined it would be.

But it made me realize that so much of what we were expecting just wasn't important. I didn't concern myself with the perfect chandelier over the crib. I was just happy that we had a safe and warm home to return to once our baby was ready." Sarah shared.

On November 16th, 2010 at 9:08 A.M., seventy-nine days after being hospitalized, more than a month before her due date, Charles Cypert arrived via emergency C-section. His umbilical cord had become knotted and he was in distress. Born with a severely cleft lip and palate, Charles would spend the first 6 weeks of his life in the NICU.

Wade continued to work while Sarah spent her days at the NICU with Charles. Wade would drop Sarah off in the early morning as he went to work and then join her again after work at the hospital to spend time with Charles.

"Other than a bathroom, I couldn't find a quiet place to go in the hospital. I remember going into the pump room just off the NICU to express milk. Still all I could hear were hospital sounds because in reality, you're still right in the middle of it. There is no privacy or in the NICU." Sarah recalls.

"I would arrive early in the morning and be there until night. I had moments that I just needed a break from it all. That's when the nurses explained that I could use the Ronald McDonald Family Room."

Sarah had seen families from out of town going to the Family Room but thought that because she was local, she did not qualify to use the room.

"The Family Room was amazing! When I would find myself feeling stressed I'd find my way to the Family Room for a moment of peace.





"I was aware other families were dealing with worse than our situation and I felt bad if I broke down in front of them. If I wanted to be by myself, I could go to the Family Room and have my melt-downs. It became my safe place. It was just a really peaceful place for me to go. I'm so grateful that it was available." Sarah said.

"It may not sound like a big deal ...

until you've been there. Then you realize how important it is to have the Family Room available. When you are there, whatever the medical reason, YOUR experience is all consuming and you need the moments away from the hospital environment. It seems not as many people talk about the Family Rooms as the Ronald McDonald House. The house is AMAZING, but when you are basically living in the NICU, the Family Room is a lifeline."

The rooms are an extension of the Ronald McDonald House and offer a living area, a kitchen complete with snacks and drinks, a bathroom with a shower, laundry facilities, many of the comforts of home for anyone with a child admitted in the hospital for any reason.

At three months of age, Charles had his first reconstructive surgery. There have been 11 surgeries to date. During each hospitalization, the Cypert family was comforted by the use of the Family Room.

"Compared to what others are going through our

issues seem less significant. We are not dealing with terminal or life-threatening illness or injury. We *have* gone through more surgeries than most.



"Even after 11 surgeries, it's hard.

The support we get at the Ronald McDonald Family Room is so important. Many people know what RMHC is but don't realize that the Family Rooms serve *all* families of hospitalized children. Whether you live in Lubbock or far away, when your child is hospitalized, you aren't leaving any more than you have to. I don't think people realize that you can utilize the rooms even if you're local." said Sarah.

The Cypert family now supports RMHC in many ways: volunteering, donating, and sharing their story to bring awareness to Ronald McDonald House Charities.

14 YEARS OF SERVICE



When LaCour Clark's grandson, Cameron was born there were some problems. Cameron's lungs were not fully developed and had holes in them and he aspirated amniotic fluid during his C-section delivery.

Cameron was put on a ventilator and given steroids to develop his lungs. Because he was

strong and attempted to pull his tubes and IV out, they kept him sedated. He was given multiple blood transfusion. The doctors informed the family that he was very sick and probably would not survive.

For the next 3 weeks, Cameron fought for his life in the Medical Center Hospital NICU in Odessa. His parents, Mandy and Chris Clark and their family used the Ronald McDonald Family Room during the hospitalization.





Thankful for RMHC's care for his family during a difficult time, Cameron's Grandfather, LaCour began volunteering weekly as a way to support the RMHC mission.

This year, Cameron started high school and LaCour is still helping RMHC families. We're thankful for the consistent presence of LaCour and the Clark family.

Death is not something anyone of us will escape indefinitely and making a plan for your legacy today may indeed help divert your wealth from some taxes as well as help the established organizations you support.



Nothing brings home the reality of your new normal after you have gone through a medical crisis with a child more than traveling home to an empty refrigerator and empty cupboards. Getting to go home is the greatest gift and then you realize the road ahead may not be the one you planned. RMHC is proud to introduce our House to Home Program that gives families a few more hours to settle in and get used to their new normal.

The extreme rise in medical costs, living expenses, and trying to keep a family afloat is something that most families face today. A majority of the families in our service area live at or below the median income level. Realizing that for many of the families leaving RMHC, financial stress from the experience is still ahead of them. We have started a House to Home Program. Each family receives a departure bag designed to provide essentials to cover the bases for a few days to help make a successful transition home.

While our house operations team gathers and organizes a bag that includes, but is not limited to, cooking essentials, household essentials, pet items, gas assistance and other available products, the family can fill out a simple survey that shares their experience at RMHC to help us improve and sustain the programs we already have in place.

Our mission is to create, find and support programs that directly improve the health and well-being of children and their families. This program is one way that RMHC is helping keep families close.
