RMHC Movie Release set for 2023

BASED ON THE UNTOLD TRUE STORY UDREY'S CHILDREN

> Dedicated to Dr. Audrey Evans 1925-2022

Like many stories of hope, there are chapters with heartache. The untold true story of Audrey's Children, now filming, will tell the story of Dr. Audrey Evans, the revolutionary pediatric oncologist best known as the co-founder of Ronald McDonald House Charities. Evans discovered groundbreaking treatment methods for pediatric cancer in the 1970's. She put her reputation and career on the line to administer her methods to patients while providing housing for families seeking treatment. Evans went to extreme lengths to save the lives of children.

Evans' story covers her pioneering role as the first woman of oncology, and she is recognized as perhaps the

nation's most significant female physician.

In 1970, 90 percent of children with neuroblastoma, the most common tumor in pediatric cancer, were dying. Treatments were ineffective. and those that worked often caused irreparable damage. Enter Evans. Brilliant, British and bold, she tackled flawed. static treatments to overhaul blanket treatment methods. uncovering a groundbreaking way to save children's lives. Well ahead of its time, the Evans Staging System was the genesis of what's now a 75-80% survival rate for neuroblastoma patients.

The film is being written and co-produced by Julia Fisher Farbman who has known Evans well in her life. Farbman remembers vividly an encounter with family friend Audrey Evans when she was about 10 years old. Evans was Chief of Staff at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and took time to personally greet Farbman as she was ushered


schedules. Two carts are ready to roll in Lubbock, and two more will be joining the fleet in the Permian Basin Family Rooms soon.



"To the millions of people whose lives she has changed, *Audrey's Children* is dedicated to you. In your lowest moments or in your biggest struggles, I hope you find comfort and inspiration in knowing that Dr. Audrey Evans dedicated her entire life to bettering yours." said Farbman.

Ami Canaan Mann is directing and co-producing the film. She is well known for many projects. Filming has started and is expected to premier in 2023. "It is such an honor to help tell the story of this incredible pioneer, a legend and personification of the truism that tenacity, good will and grace can move mountains, if we let it," said Mann. "Thousands of children continue to benefit from the advancements Audrey fought for in children's oncology. Our team feels great privilege in the opportunity to shine a light on the life of the woman behind that work." Said Mann.

"Timing is everything, and now is the time to tell Dr. Evans'

story," says Philadelphia Region RMHC CEO Susan Campbell. "This is an individual who truly changed the world—one who was not only committed to the care of children but also understood that a sick child is a sick family."

Today Evans is still helping children at age 97. She retired at age 84. "I can't wait to see this movie," says Evans, who never had any children of her own. "It's taken work—like my life has."


