The Heart of the House



When Bianca was not at the hospital with her newborn daughter, Katalella, she was found in the kitchen at the Ronald McDonald House. Right by Bianca's side was her own mother, Sandra. Bianca found it comforting to spend her downtime cooking. She is a certified chef and has worked in restaurants for a long time. Being able to cook and eat what she liked was a nice change of pace from her pregnancy, which had been difficult and sometimes made it impossible for her to keep down food or water. "There were times when I would

go for days without eating", Bianca said.

Bianca and Jesus, Katalella's father, live close to the Texas-New Mexico border between Seminole and Hobbs. Even though Bianca had a difficult time throughout her pregnancy, she reached a point when she knew she needed to seek medical care. "One day, I just felt something was completely wrong."

Bianca's instincts were right, and she was transferred from Covenant in Hobbs to Lubbock. Bianca was kept in the hospital until Katalella reached 31 weeks. Katalella was born 9 weeks early. Katalella was moved to the NICU and Bianca moved into the Ronald McDonald House. Jesus was able to come and visit but wasn't able to stay full time due to work. During one of his trips, Jesus and Bianca went shopping to stock up on food and snacks for their fellow housemates. They

both knew how important having easy and convenient access to food and meals in the House was to families and wanted to give back.

Bianca's mom. Sandra. came from El Paso to stay with Bianca at the House. Although her daughter was grown, Sandra could not stop herself from wanting to be close to her daughter while she was going through her postpartum recovery. Bianca insisted on cooking for her mom—and anyone wandered into the kitchen at the right time—but having her mom nearby was able to ease some of Bianca's burdens and worries.

Our Guest Chefs are the best at filling bellies and warming hearts at RMHC. Guest Chefs are volunteer groups--families, friends, church groups, student groups, coworkers, restaurants, and sometimes individuals--who cook for the families staying at the Ronald McDonald House. They mostly cook dinner for the House, though we also have groups that cook breakfast or lunch. Additionally, we have a sub-group of

Guest Chefs, called Freezer Friends, who make meals that we can freeze and serve later. On average, our Guest Chefs feed 30 people each night. From spaghetti to tacos to casseroles, Guest Chefs make sure that families have a hot meal waiting for them when they come from the hospital back to the House.

Our Guest Chefs play an integral role in caring for the families staying at the Ronald McDonald House. When parents have a child in the hospital, it can be hard for them to make the time to take care of their own needs because of how focused they are on their child's health. Guest Chefs take one of the families' worries off their plate by filling it with delicious food.
